

ISBE Reports Rankin's Average Class Size as 18.4 while the state average is 20.8. Rankin's small class sizes and focus on individualized student attention are staples of the District's foundation for success. Rankin has a 14:1 Teacher to Student ratio as the state average is 17:1 Rankin boasts a 94.4% student attendance rate in comparison of the state average of 91.2%.

The Rankin Board of Education was one of 45 Boards in Illinois to earn IASB's 2023 School Board Governance Recognition Designation.
